OBITUARY

MICK GREEN

Many of you will already have heard the sad news of the death of Mick Green. Mick died on 6th February after a short illness. For those of us who worked closely with Mick at Loughborough University the loss of such a great colleague and friend has been overwhelming. As a colleague Mick was a true team player more than willing to do his share of the routine administrative work that is a feature of any large department and someone who greeted the eccentricities of organisational life with a wry smile.

For most ISSA members Mick will be known for his research and publications. In his all too brief career at Loughborough – just over four years – he had established himself as a leading researcher in the field of elite sport policy, a field he had begun to define in early work with Ben Oakley. During his time on the staff in the School of Sport and Exercise Sciences Mick published two books and over a dozen articles and was increasingly in demand as a presenter at specialist conferences on elite sport systems. Despite his rapidly growing international reputation Mick was someone who wore his scholarship lightly. He had a tremendously infectious enthusiasm for teaching, research and scholarship and, as someone who came into academic life late, he was determined to make up for lost time. Mick's untimely death has robbed us of a wonderful colleague and a generous and talented scholar. However, there are others whose loss is far greater and our thoughts are with Mick's partner, mother and brothers.

GRADUATE PAPER AWARD 2009

The 2009 ISSA Graduate Paper Award is co-sponsored by ISSA and SAGE

The aim of the International Sociology of Sport Association's (ISSA) Graduate Paper Award is to facilitate the integration of outstanding graduate students into the international community of sociology of sport scholars. The award will be granted to a scholarly paper, authored by a graduate student, which is deemed by a panel of judges to demonstrate considerable originality, critical and analytical ability, and to be of the highest quality from among those submitted¹. The winning author will be invited to receive the award and present the paper at the Annual Conference of the ISSA. The winning paper may be considered for publication in the *International Review for the Sociology of Sport*.

Eligibility

• Any student who is registered for masters or doctoral level graduate work at the time her or his paper is submitted.

- The committee will accept only one submission per author.
- Full-time faculty and academic staff are not eligible.
- Previous winners are not eligible.

Award

- The winning author will be invited to present the paper at the ISSA Conference, July 15-19, 2009 in Utrecht, Netherlands.
- **SAGE Publisher sponsored prize** of £150 worth of books.
- *ISSA sponsored prize* of membership in ISSA for 12 months in the year in which the award is granted.

• The winning paper may be considered for publication in the *International Review for the Sociology of Sport.*

• The panel of judges may also give up to two honourable mentions. Graduate students receiving an honourable mention will also have their papers accepted for presentation at the ISSA conference.

• The name of all winning authors will be posted on the ISSA website.

Requirements

• Candidates are to submit a 3000-6000 word scholarly paper on a topic that is of interest to the international sociology of sport academic community.

- Papers with a text of over 6000 words will not be considered.
- Authors are to submit a cover page that contains the title of the paper and the full contact information of the author.
- Authors must be graduate students at the time the paper is submitted.

• Authors are to submit a letter, signed by her or his academic advisor, verifying their graduate student status.

• Authors are to follow a style consistent with the publication guidelines for the *International Review for the Sociology of Sport.*

• Papers should be submitted electronically (in Microsoft Word format attachment) to the Award Committee Chair, Kimberly S. Schimmel at **kschimme@kent.edu**.

DEADLINE FOR RECEIPT OF SUBMISSIONS: MARCH 21st 2009.

The winner will be announced by June 2009.
