

The International Society for the History of Physical Education and Sport (ISHPES) and the Brazilian Society for the History of Physical Education and Sport will hold a joint Congress at Gama Filho University in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

The Congress takes place at Candelaria Campus of Universidade Gama Filho, at Avenida Rio Branco, 62, Center City, with support from the University, from the City of Rio de Janeiro, and other Government institutions. This place lies in the historical part of the City, with beautiful buildings, excellent restaurants, theatres and museums, as well as churches. The international airport, Galeao, is placed in Ilha do Governador, not far from the site of the Congress. There are express ways between the two places.

The event represents a special opportunity to interact and network with researchers from all over the world, in particular with colleagues from Latin America on themes related to the history of physical education and sport.
