She holds a PhD in Sociology from Michigan State University, a MA in International Affairs and Development from the American University in Washington, DC; Currently the President of ISA RC40 Sociology of Agriculture and Food.

2013-2018 Allison was a Visiting Scientist at the UN Food and Agriculture Organization leading a participatory research project with innovators across more than 15 countries in Africa, Asia, Europe and Latin America. She is the lead author of two recent internationally comparative studies: Constructing Markets for Agroecology (FAO, 2018) and Innovative markets for sustainable agriculture (FAO, 2016).
