


Du Secrétariat - From the Secretariat

Alors que la date-limite du 31 mars 1982 est largement échue, un certain nombre de programmes de sessions pour le Xe Congrès mondial ne nous sont pas encore parvenus. Nous pressons vivement tous les organisateurs de sessions qui ne l'ont pas fait de nous faire parvenir sans délai leur programme complet. Cette invitation s'adresse aussi bien aux responsables des symposia que des sessions des Comités de recherche, des Groupes ad-hoc et des SSO (sessions spéciales).

Les résumés analytiques ("abstracts") des Communications du Xe Congrès mondial devaient parvenir au Secrétariat avant le ler février 1982. Nous avons obtenu de Sociological Abstracts de différer d'un mois cette échéance. Par conséquent seuls les résumés parvenus au ler mars paraîtront dans le livre des "abstracts" du Congrès. Nous espérons cependant que les autres pourront être publiés dans les éditions ultérieures de Sociological Abstracts.

Il nous est désagréable de constater qu'au moment d'aller sous presse, hormis une promesse informelle de l'UNESCO, aucune subvention n'a été reçue par le Comité des fonds de voyage. Il est évident que cette situation risque d'être fâcheuse sur le Congrès. Nous gardons néammoins toutes les demandes, lesquelles seront étudiées par le Comité des fonds de voyage dès que des montants seront disponibles. Nous engageons tous les participants au futur Congrès mondial à tenter d'obtenir des organismes locaux le financement de leur voyage.

Certains de nos correspondants nous réclament des accusés de réception de leur courrier. Ce problème a été débattu par le Comité exécutif à sa dernière réunion. Compte tenu que nous recevons littéralement des milliers d'envois (programmes, résumés analytiques, textes de communication, demandes diverses), l'Exécutif a décidé de ménager les fonds de l'AIS et demandé au Secrétariat d'accuser réception uniquement dans les cas ou existent des raisons supplémentaires pour écrire.

Enfin, nous avons le plaisir d'annoncer l'arrivée début avril au Secrétariat d'Izabela Barlinska. Initialement prévue pour décembre 1981 (V. Bulletin 27, p.2) cette arrivée a été retardée par les événements de Pologne. Izabela a immédiatement pris sa part dans le travail de préparation du Congrès mondial. Although the deadline of March 31st is now well past, a certain number of programmes for sessions in the X. World Congress have still not arrived. We urge all those session organizers who have not already done so to send us their complete programme immediately. This appeal is addressed at those responsible for symposia as well as those responsible for Research Committee sessions, Ad Hoc groups, and SSO's.

The deadline for the abstracts was February 1st. We have negotiated an extension of one month with Sociological Abstracts. Therefore, only abstracts received before the 1st of March will appear in the book of abstracts that will be distributed at the Congress. We hope that the remaining abstracts will be published in future editions of Sociological Abstracts.

We regret to report that at the time of going to press we still have not received a single travel grant, although we have an informal promise from UNESCO. If we do not receive any grants of travel assistance soon, this will have very serious consequences for the World Congress. In the meantime, we are keeping all requests on file. If and when we receive some funds, our Travel Grants Committee will meet and try to distribute the available funds as fairly as possible. We trust that all potential participants in the World Congress will make every effort to find travel assistance without hoping for help from the ISA.

We have received a number of requests to acknowledge the receipt of mail. This problem was discussed with the Executive Committee because it would impose a serious strain on our resources. We literally receive thousands of abstracts, papers, programmes, and other assorted correspondence. To conserve the modest funds at our disposal for other purposes, the Executive Committee decided that we should not write letters only to acknowledge receipt of something. We very much regret that the constraints of the real world have forced us to take this decision. Thus, we are acknowledging receipt only if there is also an additional reason for writing.

In the last Bulletin we had announced the anticipated arrival of Izabela Barlinska (No. 27, p.2). Due to the recent events in Poland her arrival had been delayed; but we are happy to announce that she has arrived early in April and is already immersed in the preparations for the World Congress.



PUBLICATIONS COMMITTEE

A meeting was held on 26 February in Brussels which was attended by: Jacques Dofny (Chair), Ulf Himmelstrand (President), Céline Saint-Pierre (Editor, SSIS), Jim Beckford (Editor, CS), Margaret Archer, Andrée Michel, Else Øyen, Sara McCune and Penny Head (Sage), Kurt Jonassohn (Secretary), and observers.

Jim Beckford presented the report on Current Sociology. Since several manuscripts are now late in being submitted, it was agreed that they should be published in the order in which they are submitted in order to keep the journal appearing on time.

Céline Saint-Pierre presented the report on SSIS on the status of the volumes in production and preparation. However, the major discussion dealt with the preparations for the publication of volumes arising out of the work of the forthcoming World Congress and the revision of the contract with Sage. A number of suggestions were discussed that would speed up the time between the proposals for volumes and their actual publication. Sara McCune suggested that we distribute a prospectus to potential editors that should specify the contents of a publication proposal so that the submitted information would be more complete and permit the taking of decisions without additional correspondence; this proposal was accepted and such a prospectus will be available in the near future. Since conditions have changed since our contract with Sage was signed, and since a number of modifications have been introduced since then, it was thought desirable to work out a new contract. Sage submitted a draft and it was decided to collect comments and to continue its discussion by correspondence.

Finally, plans were discussed for a meeting of the Publications Committee together with the SSIS Editorial Board immediately after the World Congress. This meeting would go over those publication proposals in hand in order to arrive at some immediate decisions. In this way, the first volumes from the World Congress should be able to go into production much earlier than in the past.

AD HOC COMMITTEE ON THE RELOCATION OF THE ISA SECRETARIAT

This meeting was held on 27 February in Brussels. Present were: Ulf Himmelstrand (Chair), Margaret Archer, Jacques Dofny, Céline Saint-Pierre, Kurt Jonassohn and Marcel Rafie (Secretaries), and observers.

This committee was struck to study and to make recommendations on leaving the Secretariat in Montreal or accepting the invitation of either Amsterdam or Brussels. Not much time was spent on Montreal because the Secretariat had been there for eight years and, although a formal invitation for an additional period had been received, the lack of subventions made this an impractical choice. Dossiers on the two other invitations, already circulated, were discussed. Representatives from Amsterdam and

from Brussels appeared before the committee separately to comment on their invitations and to respond to questions. The representatives from Amsterdam were Felix Geyer, Jan Berting and Walter Becking. Those from Brussels were N. Delruelle-Vosswinkel, M. Bolle de Bal, Thérèse Beaupain, Margaretha Lisein Norman.

In order to assess these invitations, the committee decided to evaluate them in terms of a series of criteria. While this procedure facilitated an orderly discussion, it did not help in arriving at a decision. Both invitations were found to be excellent prospects for the future location of the secretariat. The final recommendation to the executive committee was for Amsterdam by a narrow majority.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

A one-day meeting was held on 28 February in Brussels. Present were: Ulf Himmelstrand (Chair), Jacques Dofny, Anne-Marie Guillemard, Khatchik Momdjian, Alexander Szalai, Ralph Turner, Gerardo Estrada and Jorge Basurto and Teresa Martinez (MLAC), Kurt Jonassohn and Marcel Rafie (Executive Secretaries), and several observers.

The recommendation concerning the relocation of the secretariat was discussed at length because neither invitation was found to be clearly preferable to the other. In fact, a motion was passed unanimously, expressing the Executive's full confidence in the ability of both institutes to conduct the affairs of the ISA competently. Again, Amsterdam was selected by a narrow majority. However, by previous agreement at the last meeting of the Executive Committee, this decision had to be made by the full Executive Committee. Therefore, a telegram was drafted, asking the absent members to express their preference. (Note: The result of this vote favoured Amsterdam.)

The reports of the Publication Committee were accepted. One unresolved problem concerned translation. While the Committee suggested that an international organization could not restrict its publications to English, the cost of translation presented a very real problem in these times of financial austerity. In principle, it was agreed that the ISA should facilitate translations; the implementation of such a principle was tabled to a consideration of the budget.

The Membership and Finance Committee recommended approval of the admission of several new collective members and some minor revisions of the 1982 budget to take account of increasing costs due to inflation. Both recommendations were approved.

The final report from the Statutes Revision Committee was reviewed. Several minor changes concerning stylistic and editorial matters were approved. The revisions to the Statutes and the new By-Laws were then approved for distribution to the ISA Council which will deal with them at their meeting during the World Congress.

Ralph Turner took the chair for the discussion of the forthcoming World Congress. Gerardo Estrada presented a new report from MLAC. A proposal to reduce the registration fee for certain colleagues was discussed and rejected. Some final revisions to the official program were approved. The most serious problem discussed was our failure to raise any funds for travel grants. There is still some hope of receiving support from UNESCO and from the Mexican government; a number

of meetings and approaches were planned in the hope of still finding some funds to assist at least some of those in need of travel support.

Since the Executive Committee is to present a slate of candidates for the elections to the Nominating Committee in Council, a list of ten names was prepared and these nominees will be approached for their agreement to serve if elected.

The Research Coordinating Committee produced a recommendation, by mail ballot, to change the name of RC 09. The new name "Social Practice and Social Transformation" was approved.

Finally, an unanimous motion of thanks was passed to express our appreciation for the arrangements for these meetings and for the warm hospitality to the Institut de Sociologie and to its officers.

LEON PETRAZYCKI INTERNATIONAL SCIENTIFIC PRIZE

This is to announce that the Leon Petrazycki International Scientific Prize 1980, initiated at the meeting of the Sociology of Law Research Committee during the World Sociological Congress in Uppsala 1978, and established by the Sociology of Law Section of the Polish Sociological Association in order to promote the further research on motivational and educative effects of law on the development of the general premises and methods of conscious influence on the social development with help of legal policy and also in order to commemorate the pioneer activity in the above mentioned fields of Leon Petrazycki the eminent Polish lawyer, sociologist and philosopher of international fame and renown and fierce fighter for human rights and dignity - has been given to the Most Respectable Doctor in Law, Master of Arts,

GUNTHER TEUBNER PROFESSOR AT THE UNIVERSITY OF BREMEN

His eminent study "Organisations, Demokratie und Verbandsverfassung. Rechtsmodelle für politisch relevante Verbände" has been unanimously recommended by all members of the International Selection Committee, established according to paragraph 2 of the Prize's Regulations, and composed of:

ZHIVKO OSHAVKOV 1913-1982

Zhivko Oshavkov was the host of the Seventh World Congress of Sociology that was held in Varna, Bulgaria in 1970 and from 1970-74 he was a Vice-President of the International Sociological Association.

He studied philosophy at the University of Sofia (1934-36) and sociology at the Sorbonne in Paris (1936-39). He was Associate Professor of Philosophy at Sofia University from 1948-54, was elected senior research worker at the Institute of Philosophy in 1952 and professor in 1961. He was the Director of the Institute of Sociology from 1968 to 1973, Head of the Department of General Sociology since 1968, and Doctor of Philosophical Sciences in 1971.

Professor Oshavkov was a founding member and General Secretary of the Bulgarian Sociological Society from 1959 to 1965 and was the President of the Bulgarian Sociological Association since 1965. In 1971 he was awarded the title of Honoured Worker of Science.

His main publications are: "Historical Materialism as a Science" (Sofia, 1953), "Historical Materialism and Sociology" (Sofia, 1958), "On the Character, Methodology and Method of Sociological Investigations" (Sofia, 1960), "Sociology as a Science" (Sofia, 1970), and he was editor of the collective work "The Sociological Structure of Modern Bulgarian Society" (Sofia, 1976).

THE YONINA TALMON PRIZE

The seventh Yonina Talmon Prize will be given in 1983 for an article on the sociology of the kibbutz, collective settlements, and planned communities. This prize carries an award of \$400.00.

Persons may apply up to ten years after receiving their doctorate.

FIRST NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF THE SPANISH SOCIOLOGICAL ASSOCIATION

About three hundred sociologists from all over Spain met at their First National Conference in Saragossa during the last week of September 1981. The occasion was a momentous one for contemporary Spanish sociology, for, under the Francoist dictatorship, sociologists had encountered considerable difficulties in forming an association. With the demise of that regime in 1977, several regional associations were finally formed. Some of them, like the Catalan Sociological Association, with its seat in Barcelona, already had a long history of attempts to organize into a legally recognized association.

By 1978 there were several associations already functioning, or being formed, such as the Aragonese, the Catalan, the Basque, and the Castilian. In June of that year, the last three associations met at Madrid and formed an ad hoc coordinating committee. With the entry of the Andalusian Sociological Association into the process, a Federal Council for all Spanish Associations was set up formally at Granada in 1979. The Presidency of the newly-formed Spanish Federation of Sociological Associations fell upon Professor José Cazorla (then President of the Andalusian Association) and the Vice-Presidency upon Professor Salvador Giner (then President of the Catalan Association); Dr. Alfonso Pérez Penasco was appointed Executive Secretary, based in Madrid. One individual member of the Spanish Sociological Federation, Professor Juan Linz, already sits on the ISA Executive. Shortly after these events, the International Sociological Association granted the Spanish Federation full status as an "A" member.

The Spanish Association maintains a federal structure which is very much in consonance with the cultural and political characteristics of the country itself and now comprises the immense majority of Spanish sociologists. Its aims are strictly professional and scientific and it is apolitical, although it very much identifies with democracy and accepts the Constitutional order which the country now enjoys.

The host of the First Congress was the Aragonese Association. It took place at the University of Saragossa though some important meetings were also held in the Saragossa City Hall. It is impossible to give a detailed account of the many debates, communications, round table discussions, and forums that took place. Suffice it to say that the following sections functioned during the Conference: Latin America, Sociology of Art and Literature, Sociology of Mass Communication, Demography, Sociology of Education, Epistemology, Social Structure, Sociology of Women and the Family, Sociology of Youth, Deviance, Methodology, Military Sociology, Sociology of Nationalities and Nationalism, Bureaucracy and Organization, Political Sociology, the Profession of Sociology, Sociology of Religion, Rural Sociology, Medical Sociology, Sociolinguistics, Sociology of Sex, Sociology of the Aged, Industrial and Labour Sociology, and Urban Sociology. Some of them (e.g., Rural Sociology and Sociology of Medicine) were extremely well attended and functioned with several subsections. In fact, they became small sub-conferences in themsleves. Others (e.g., Military Sociology), while smaller, had extremely good papers presented in them.

Spanish and foreign attendants left with an optimistic feeling that this Conference completed the much-delayed institutional coming of age of the sociological discipline in Spain and that its future now looks very promising indeed. The quality and volume of the current output by Spanish sociologists in all fields of the discipline lends credence to this belief. Spanish sociologists have, of course, a great number of professional and other problems, but both the creation of their Association and their first Conference at Saragossa are signs that they are firmly on their way to solve them.
