

Apart from symposium IV, all symposia consist of four sessions; the extra session IV-5 will take place during an evening yet to be decided upon;

- the Research Committee's sessions

will be given ten time slots of two hours each, 14:00-16:00 and 16:30-18:30, from Monday. August 19, 1986 through Friday, August 22, 1986;

- Working Groups and Ad Hoc Groups

will have in principle the same time slots available as the Research Committees; Eventual program-overflow of the Research Com-

mittees and other groups can be accommodated by evening sessions, in time slots to be arranged with the Indian Local Arrangements Committee.

During its next meeting scheduled for July 1984 in Pavia (Italy), the Program Committee will decide upon the definite version of the Congress theme.

Symposium I Sociological Theories and Social Change

Coordinator: Alessandro Cavalli (Italy)

The need to rethink theory in sociology is felt more today than in the recent past. Sociology has always been a field and a meeting point for conflicting theories. Never in the history of sociology has any one theoretical paradigm been dominant at any particular time, not even structural-functionalism in the 1950's.

The sixties was a period of lively debate among conflicting theoretical perspectives, due in part to the revival of Marxist Sociology in the western world and of phenomenological and historical sociology. With the decline of the ideological cleavages, however, the seventies became a period during which there was a sort of pluralistic coexistence of different theories, none of which claimed to become a dominant paradigm.

The eighties will probably be a time for theoretical comparison in the face of unresolved theoretical issues and dilemmas: social change and/or social transition, social action theory versus social structure theory, macro versus microsociology.

A critical review of past developments is particularly needed in the field of social change theories. The issues concerned include: the ambiguities of the concept of modernization, the neglect of the time dimension in theories of change, the notions of social complexity and social differentiation, etc.

This symposium has been designed in order to offer an occasion for debating these issues which confront the sociological community and to encourage the research of new theoretical approaches which will be able to combine and integrate the various existing, but isolated, perspectives.

Symposium II Social Institutions and Change Coordinator: Melvin Kohn (USA)

The intent of these sessions is to examine social change in relation to specific social institutions, for example, the family, the organization of work, the system of social stratification, political institutions. One session will be devoted to social change within institutions, for example. changes in family structure and functioning. A second session will be devoted to social movements and merging institutions, looking at the processes by which social movements do or do not become institutionalized. A third session will foccs on the relationship among social institutions, with an emphasis on how change in one social institution (for example, the organization of work) affects other social institutions (such as the system of stratification). The final session will examine the failures of institutions and the gaps between institutions, considering unmet social needs and non-institutionalized, informal mechanisms for meeting those needs.

Symposium III Science and Technology in Social Change Coordinator: Joji Watanuki (Japan)

We are now entering into a new phase of development of science and technology especially in such fields as micro-electronics, biotechnology and space-science; their impacts on societies both in national and international terms are enormous.

The sessions under Symposium III intend to analyze those impacts empirically, both nationally and internationally, and also from the viewpoint of how to control their negative impacts. We have to broaden our time perspective to include both the past, i.e. emergence of modern science and technology, and the future consequences of new science and technology. Special attention shall be directed to the relationship between science and technology on the one hand and social values on the other: while science and technology seem to bring with them globally uniform patterns of consumption and ways of life, we should understand their relation to the persistence of traditional values in societies and the recent revival of religious fundamentalism, ethnic identity, etc.

Symposium IV Social Aspects of Economic Development Coordinator: Erwin Scheuch (Germany)

Symposium V The Cultural Dimension of Social Change

Coordinator: Margaret Archer (England)

The rationale behind this theme derives from the paradox that whilst all sociologists agree that social change has an important cultural dimension, there is no accord whatsoever in what this is. In turn it seems that this situation arises because the conceptualization of culture is extraordinary in two respects. Firstly it has displayed the weakest analytical development of any key concept in sociology - at the descriptive level the notion of 'Culture' remains inordinately vague and is in every way the poor relation of 'structure'. Secondly it has played the most wildly vascillating role within sociological theory - at the explanatory level the status of culture oscillates between that of a supremely independent variable, the superordinate power in society, and a position of supine dependence on other social institutions.

Since conceptual clarification thus seems to be a pre-condition of any discussion about the cultural dimension of social change, the first subtheme is devoted to this task.

Subtheme V-1 The Rise, Fall and Resurrection of the Concept of Culture

This will deal with the emergence of the concept; how through its anthropological handling it came to engulf the entire social structure; how it declined into the position of a dependent variable outside the functionalist tradition; but the session will concentrate on contemporary efforts to reconceptualize culture as neither a completely dependent nor independent variable.

Subtheme V-2 Cultural Contradictions and Continuities in Social Change
This represents a continuation of the first theme and especially addresses the question of whether a parallelism can be established between the analysis of social structure (in terms of, for example, contradictions/complementaries or strains/compatibilities) and that of culture.

Subtheme V-3 Cultural Maps and Cultural Mapmaking

This session is less macroscopic in its focus than the preceding theme. It seeks to explore the neglected problem of the 'cultural map' which every social actor carries in his/her head, but whose components, contours and lay-out vary historically, comparatively and individually. The key theoretical issue to discuss concerns the factors inducing and producing map-making.

Subtheme V-4 The Changing Faces of Religion This provides a substantive reference point and fund of illustration for the prior, abstract, theoretical debates. By taking its various manifestations (from primitive belief systems to the latest quasireligious movements), religion constitutes a testing-ground for any theory of culture and it is hoped that different contributors will respond to this challenge.

Symposium VI Sociology of Peace, Militarization and Conflict Resolution Coordinators: Ulf Himmelstrand (Sweden) and Artur Meier (GDR).

A number of intransigent and puzzling questions face us in this problem area: if the earlier phases of the arms race were motivated largely by mutual fears, why do these fears, with the level of 'overkill' now achieved, not lead to some

graduated reciprocal reduction of nuclear weaponry? Are there other factors than 'mutual fears' which operate in this context? An alternative hypothesis is that escalation of tension and arms production and dissemination is a result not of international fears, but of international competition between interest groups in economic, political and military establishments of nations. These alternative hypotheses on mutual fears and intranational conflicts (as well as other hypotheses) entail different and sometimes testable assumptions about structural and operational features, and of military-technological levels of national establishments in different countries, and in different systems of alliances. Such assumptions could be made explicit and their empirical status could be discussed in session VI-1. which is devoted to examining the state of the art of this growing particular subarea of sociological studies.

Depending on whether you take the international mistrust or the intranational conflict hypothesis as your main premise (the two may of course be combined) different conclusions follow on the impact of broad-based popular peace movements under different conditions. In session VI-2 these various conclusions could be discussed and sometimes empirically illuminated if not strictly tested empirically. Descriptive empirical studies concerning mobilization, recruitment, beliefs and styles of action of peace movements would also fit well into session VI-2. Questions should be raised here about the conditions and consequences of <u>peace</u> movements as agents of latent as well as of manifest social change within nations and/or of international perspective. In examining the international aspects of the social movements for peace the universality of this phenomehon could be discussed as well as its peculiarities in several regions of the world and the interacting links between the different 'sections' of this global movement.

Due to the fact that the two topics and sessions suggested above could trigger off a type of cold war rhetoric which absolutely must be avoided, we must insist on objective analyses based on valid scientific research. We have two other sessions under the theme VI which deal with problem areas less susceptible to cold war rhetoric. Values and conflict resolution can be illuminated on the basis of empirical research of historical, sociological and socio-psychological nature. The theme of militarization is salient in several areas of the world, and relates to the tendency to apply military means not only to cleavages between states but also to internal conflicts within societies, particularly in Third World countries.

The Working Party established by the Publications Committee met in Barcelona, December 1983, and agreed to work towards launching a new Journal of the ISA - INTERNATIONAL SOCIOLOGY.

Each year the 37 Research Committees generate hundreds of papers, yet at the moment this material becomes dispersed among a number of outlets and this fails to reinforce the growth of the Research Committees or the ISA in general. Most of this material, and that produced by regional conferences does not fit the format of our two present publications, CURRENT SOCIOLOGY and the SAGE STUDIES IN INTERNATIONAL SOCIOLOGY book series. The following points summarize the stage reached in planning the new Journal: plans will be finalized at the Executive Committee meeting in July 1984.

Aim:

To publish high quality papers, which do not necessarily have enough mutual coherence to constitute a book, giving special attention to achieving a truly international authorship.

Format: Each issue would be published in English with brief French summaries. There would be one or sometimes two thematic sections and another section made-up of unrelated papers. Four issues would be produced per year, of approximately 112 printed pages each.

Starting date: Spring 1986

Editor: Professor Martin Albrow (University College, P.O. Box 78, Cardiff CF1 1XL, England), at present Editor of SOCIO-LOGY, the Journal of the British Sociological Association, has accepted the Editorship of the new Journal. He would welcome communications from any individual or group and suggestions about possible contents of the first few issues. As one role of the Journal would be to publish papers in advance/or for Research Committees' (etc.) conferences, those planning such meetings might like to contact him in this connection.

International Balzan Prize 1983

The general Committee of the International Balzan Prize awarded the 1983 Balzan Prizes in the field of social sciences to Edward Shils, Professor of Sociology at the University of Chicago, for his "important innovative and unique contribution to contemporary sociology, bringing together the more empirical tradition of American sociology with the more theoretical one of European sociology, analyzing and defending the intellectual and moral responsibility of the social sciences, emphasizing the components of civility, of the cultural tradition and of the orientation to the sacred in the development of the social order."

The prizes were established by the International Balzan Foundation of Berne, Switzerland, to recognize scholars in fields in which the Nobel Prize is not given, including the social sciences, the arts, and mathematics.

Stein Rokkan Prize 1983

The 1983 Stein Rokkan Prize in Comparative Social Sciences Research, instituted by the International Social Science Council and the Conjunto Universitario Candido Mendes, has been awarded to Professor Jens Alber of the Research Institute of Sociology, University of Cologne (FRG), for his book Vom Armenhaus zum Wohlfahrtsstaat - Analysen zur Entwicklung der Sozialversicherung in West-europa (From poor-house to welfare state. Analyses of the development of social insurance in Western Europe) and his article Einige Grundlagen und Begleiterscheinungen der Entwicklung der Sozialausgaben in Westeuropa, 1949-1977 (Some causes and consequences of social security expenditure development in Western Europe, 1949-1977).

The Jury, chaired by Professor Rudolf Wildenmann, upon whose recommendation the Prize was awarded, considered that "Alber's book is an excellent historically based study of the development of social security in Western Europe. Historical developments are skillfully linked with social science theories and explanations, which are then tested against empirical data and analysis - in terms of the relative importance of institutions, and of the value of socio-economic versus political

influences."
