Report on the 7th Slovenian Social Science Conference

The 7th Slovenian Social Science Conference, co-organized by the Junior Sociologists Network, took place at the premises of the School of Advanced Social Studies in Nova Gorica, Slovenia, between 21th and 23th of August 2015. The common thread of the Conference was to commemorate the fall of the Berlin Wall and the subsequent political, economic and cultural transformations which took place after this ground-breaking historical moment to the present day. The thematic panels of the conference embraced various processes that have ranging from macro-level structural changes to life experiences of individuals.

The event was opened by the speech of the Dean of the School, professor Matej Makarovič, and by the speech of the President of the Slovenian National Commission for UNESCO, professor Radovan Stanislav Pejovnik. The opening event was also accompanied by the welcoming words of the Chairman of the Junior Sociologists Network, International Sociological Association, Oleg Komlik. The Conference was enriched by the lectures of the invited guest speakers, namely Professor Sari Hanafi, Vice-President of the International Sociological Association, from the American University of Beirut and Professor Elena Danilova from the Russian Academy of Science.

A broad variety of presenters came from Slovakia, Romania, Germany, Czech Republic, Kazakhstan, Russia and Slovenia. Organized sessions were complemented by informal gatherings at the joint dinners, lunches and by the tour of the natural and cultural heritage at the last day of the conference.
