### **DEAR RC46 MEMBERS,**

### **GREETINGS FROM MANILA!**

Hope this email finds you relatively safe and secure despite the challenges we all face!

I would like to thank **Prof. Tina Uys**, *ISA RC 46 VP-Programme* and *RC 46 Presidential Adviser* and *member of the ISA Executive Committee* for representing RC 46 in the series of meetings held by ISA Research Committee and the **ISA Assembly regarding the ISA Congress in Melbourne**. The following are some of the decisions made.

The ISA Assembly of Councils voted to postpone the Congress till June 2023, which entails postponement of elections to 2023 (i.e., extends by one year the mandate for the ISA Executive Committee, as well as all elected officers in the RC/WG/TGs), and this extends the length of all individual memberships by one year as well.

We, the RC 46 delegates, voted with the majority in all decisions. In the ISA survey (results attached), **72% of respondents preferred postponing the conference to 2023.** This view was shared by members in both the Global North and the Global South, with a somewhat higher preference for postponement in the North (72% in the North; 66% in the South). The delegates in the National Assembly (who represent the National Association members) were also in favor of postponing (71%). Finally, the delegates of nearly all of the Research Councils, Working Groups, and Thematic Groups were in favor of postponing (91%).

On the second issue of extending the mandates, **96% of respondents preferred extending the mandate of the ISA Executive Committee if the conference is postponed.** This majority was consistent across all sub-groups.

In the Assembly of Councils meeting, strong points were raised for both having an online Congress in 2022 or for postponing to 2023 with some kind of an in-person/hybrid conference. Most of these points were raised in the qualitative comments of the attached survey.

At the ISA Assembly of Councils of 1st May, the deciding votes reflected the above surveys:

The decision regarding the date and modality of the XX World Congress to 2023, 84% were in favor of postponing to 2023 with a hybrid format. 16% voted in favor of an online conference in 2022. 6% abstaining.

- 1. For the decision to extend the mandate of the ISA Executive Committee for one year, it was suggested that the mandates be extended AND that ISA individual membership is extended by one year as well. Our vote:
  - a. 89% voted in favor of the amended motion to extend both the mandate and ISA individual memberships. 5% voted against the motion. 6% voted to abstain.
  - b. An additional vote was taken to extend by one year the mandate of all elected officers in the Research Committees, Working Groups, and Thematic Groups. 88% voted in favor of the motion. 5% voted against the motion. 9% abstained.

With these decisions made by the ISA Assembly of Councils, we are now responsible for serving until 2023 and organizing the 2023 World Congress. It is our honor and privilege to do so. Please be assured that no matter what the ultimate form of the 2023 Congress will be, we will do our best to make the Congress a success. This decision by the Assembly does not permanently change the ISA bylaws (or alter the RC09 statues), and therefore although current officers' mandates have been extended to 2023, we will hold RC 46 ordinary elections for 4-year terms in 2023.

"Radio Théâtre Forum" (Radio Foro) est une méthodologie d'intervention virtuelle, adaptée du théâtre forum, initiée dans le IV Séminaire Virtuel sur l'Intervention Psychosociale au sein de l'Universiad del Atlántico

Foro" (Radio Foro) es una metodología de intervención virtual, adaptada del teatro foro, iniciada en el IV Seminario Virtual de Intervención Psicosocial de la Universidad del Atlántico.



We organized an extraordinary edition of the Virtual Seminar on Psychosocial Intervention, that took place last April 22<sup>nd</sup>. This virtual seminar was dedicated to sharing an experience of "Radio Foro", which has been developed within the program "Regards Croisés", which is an initiative of four French associations dedicated to research, training and professional practice in psychosocial and socio-clinical intervention: Arip, Cirfip, RISC and Transition, which came together to create professional meeting spaces before the confinement caused by Covid-19.

For its part, "Radio Foro" is a methodology adapted from the "Teatro Foro" (originating in Brazil), initiated within the practical workshops of the Virtual Seminar on Psychosocial Intervention. under the coordination of professor Fernando de Yzaguirre, said Seminar also being a space for exchange in the face of confinement, in which the

challenge of developing virtual psychosocial intervention methodologies was raised. The practical workshops were organized with the collaboration of the Sociocaribe consultancy and the SIPECS seedbed.






