

2022 Meetings of the ISA Executive Committee & Research Coordination Committee

Dear Colleagues in the ISA Research Council,

After two years of virtual meetings, the ISA Executive Committee (EC) planned to meet in Moscow from 10th to 14th of April. The venue was cancelled after the Russian invasion of Ukraine and then has moved to the University of Louvain in Belgium. Some of the issues on the EC meeting agenda will have an important impact on the ISA's future. It includes major steps in the selection process of the next ISA executive secretary and of the decision about the host of the 2027 World Congress of Sociology.

The Research Coordination Committee, which is composed by the eight delegates elected by the Research Council in 2018, will meet on April 10th and 11th just before the EC meeting. You will find below the provisional agenda of the Research Coordination Committee (RCC) that will take place in Belgium. I am inviting every RC/WG/TG to suggest other points they would like the RCC delegates to discuss or work on.

The following sections on this letter focus on the Research Council meetings; the 2023 World Congress; and activity grants. Please take some minutes to read them all. And please reply to the doodle survey to choose the date of the next Research Council meeting by March 15^{th.}

4. Activity grants

If your RC/WG/TG obtained an ISA activity grant in 2019, 2020 or 2021 for an activity that had to be cancelled or postponed due to the COVID pandemic, you may use this activity grant for another activity until the ISA World Congress in 2023. These grants cannot be transferred to another 4-year period.

Possible uses include newsletters, websites, presential conferences or your RC preconference in Melbourne. The ISA Finance Committee recommends that unspent funds be used for membership fees and/or congress registration. If you plan to use the remaining grant for membership or registration than it must be done before the registration deadline of March 22, 2023

5. Other activities

Due to the heavy ISA agenda and the logistics and organizational work required by moving the 2022 EC meeting from Moscow to my university in Belgium, the start of the online seminar with the RCs has been postponed. The program of the first sessions will be included in the next VPR letter, by mid-May.
