PRESIDENT'S LETTER 1/2023

Dear RC01 members,

With just three months to go to the World Congress of Sociology in Australia, we are looking forward to seeing you all again and meeting the new members of RC01. Since my tenure as President of RC01, we have not been able to meet in person due to the Covid-19 pandemic, although we hold a joint hybrid conference with ERGOMAS in Tartu, Estonia in July 2021. The pandemic also delayed the presentation of the World Congress of Sociology, which was scheduled to take place in July 2022. With this said, the time has come to select new office bearers for RC01. The Executive Board of the RC is elected every four years, just prior to the ISA World Congress, for a four-year term. The term of the newly elected officers shall commence at this year's World Congress in July 2023. Thus, my term as President and the remaining Board comes to an end before the World Congress and we call nominations for the following positions:

- 1. President
- 2. Three Vice-Presidents
- 3. Executive Secretary/Treasurer, and
- 4. Six to eight Executive Committee Members.

Eligible for serving on the Executive Board are regular members in good standing of both the ISA and the RC, who serve for a four-year term. The term is from one quadrennial World Congress of Sociology to the next. Officers may serve more than one term, although it is recommended that they do not serve more than two terms consecutively. The elections are carried out under the direction of the Nominations and Elections Committee. Please make sure that the person you are nominating has accepted your nomination.

The strength of RC01 lies in its membership and global reach. However, we are not truly representative of all the regions in the world, and it would be good if you can encourage those from Africa, Asia, the Middle East, and Latin America to join our research committee. Any social



scientist active in research or teaching on armed forces and conflict resolution is eligible for membership. Please feel free to distribute our newsletter to interested parties. At no other time has the work of our members been more relevant, given the grave effect that Russia's invasion of Ukraine is having on the world at large. The repercussions of this new type of hybrid war and its grave implications require robust sociological engagement and discussion at various levels.
