Vale Edward ('Eddie') Webster:

We begin this month's e-Newsletter with important and sad news about the recent passing of Prof Edward ('Eddie') Webster who, among so many other contributions, played a critical role in the historical development of RC44, including his role in the founding of the *Global Labour Journal*. Edward ('Eddie') Webster, Professor of Sociology at the University of the Witwatersrand, Johannesburg, South Africa, passed away on 5 March 2024 at nearly 82 years old. Eminent scholar of the labour process, work organisation and the labour movement in South Africa, he has impacted generations of students, labour activists and colleagues. He was elected as Secretary of RC44 in 1998 and served as President (2002-2006). He was an active member of RC44 ever since. He helped to expand the section's focus to the global South, encouraging debate around informal and precarious labour organising and founded the *Global Labour Journal*. His book *Grounding Globalization: Labor in the Age of Insecurity* (2008), with Rob Lambert and Andries Bezuidenhout, was awarded the American Sociological Association's Labor and Labor Movements Section distinguished scholarly monograph prize in 2009. His most recent book, published last year, *Recasting Workers' Power*, with Lynford Dor, details the effects of technological change on work and labour, including in the gig economy, and examines new forms of worker organisation and power. He is the author of over 100 academic articles, as well as numerous research reports. Hamba Kahle, Eddie! Rest in Power!
