Call for Candidates!

Every four years, our Research Committee elects new leadership. We elect a President, a Secretary/Treasurer, and a ten-member Board consisting of two representatives from each of five world regions: Africa, Asia/ Pacific, Europe, Latin America, and North American (U.S./Canada). These officers appoint one or more Vice-Presidents. Together, this group manages the Research Committee between World Congresses.

We need people to run for election to these various offices.

Specifically, we need a new President, Secretary-Treasurer, and at least five Board members. The President and Vice-President are limited to a single term. Board members may be elected to two terms, though their reelection is not automatic. At this point, five of the current Board members have either served two terms or do not wish to run for re-election.




