We are beyond excited for the upcoming 5th ISA Sociology conference at Rabat, Morocco, 6-11 July 2025. Applications have been open for applying for granting financial support which must be submitted by *January 31, 2025* to the TG03 Programme Coordinator Dr Bhup Singh Gaur (gaurbhupsingh@yahoo.com) to ensure consideration.

- ➤ Priority will be given to: (i) Individuals from Category B and C countries as defined by the ISA; or (ii) Early-career researchers and graduate students; or (iii) Individuals whose contributions to the forum (papers, presentations, or other activities) have been accepted for inclusion in the TG03 programme. All Successful applicants will be notified by *February 25, 2025*.
- ➤ All Notification letters to Authors and co-authors of accepted abstracts has been done by December 5, 2024. To be included in the program, all participants (including presenters, chairs, discussants, etc.) must complete their registration by paying full registration fees no later than *March 22*, 2025. If not registered, names will not appear in the Program Book and Abstracts Book.

(Registration fees vary depending on <u>membership status</u> with the International Sociological Association, <u>country of residence</u>, and <u>membership category</u> (Regular, Student, or Life Member).

The publication of a new, international and transdisciplinary feminist journal titled 'Gender and Justice' dedicated to advancing critical feminist scholarship on justice in the social sciences and from different methodological perspectives will be on shelves soon. The editorial team is led by Dr Sharron FitzGerald (Cresppa-GTM, Paris, France), Professor Anna Carline (University of Liverpool, UK) and Professor Lesley McMillan, (Glasgow Caledonian University, UK). Gender and Justice is a completely new title, and the first issue



is on track to be published in March 2025. Two issues will be published per year. Research Articles are being invited for the second issue which is scheduled to be published in September. Gender and Justice will be shortly queued for indexing in Scopus and the Emerging Sources Citation Index. All research articles are subject to double anonymous peer review in the following formats: (i) Research Articles; (ii) Feminist interventions—Review Essays; (iii) Creative Feminist Methodologies; (iv) In Conversation With; and (v) Book Reviews.
