The successful candidate must have a Ph.D. in Sociology or a closely related field by the date of the appointment or shortly thereafter.

Candidates must have a record of excellence in teaching demonstrated through teaching accomplishments, strong endorsements from referees of high standing and the teaching dossier submitted as part of the application (to include a statement of teaching philosophy, sample course syllabi and teaching evaluations). Candidates also must have a record of excellence in research as demonstrated by publications in top ranked and field relevant academic journals or a research pipeline that is at high international levels, awards and accolades, presentations at significant conferences, and strong endorsements from referees of high standing.

The successful candidate will teach in the undergraduate program at St. George. They will also be a member of the Graduate Department of Sociology, University of Toronto and will teach in the graduate program. The successful applicant will join a vibrant intellectual community of world-class scholars at Canada's leading university. The
